#### Medicaid managed care RFA released; Jan 2022 start date expected

The Ohio Department of Medicaid has released the Request for Applications for the Medicaid managed care program. This is NOT the MyCare Ohio program, but rather the "community" Medicaid recipients, including Group VIII. There does not appear to be any changes to the LTSS benefits. The most significant change for LTSS providers seems to be related to the administrative area. ODM will have a fiscal intermediary that would receive all of the claims and prior authorizations. This would mean only one form for providers to submit for a claim and one form for a prior authorization regardless of the MCO. <u>Please click here to view the entire RFA.</u> The anticipated start date for the contract winners is January 2022. #### Day 3 of the virtual fall conference: COVID-19

The 2020 ASHS/OANAC (Virtual) Fall Conference and Annual Meeting will be held November 11, 12 and 13. The conference will feature different topics each day. Day three of the conference begins with a discussion of policy making during the public health emergency. Department of Aging Director Ursel McElroy will join us to talk about how the pandemic has impacted public policy making from the administrative perspective. It is definitely not "business as usual" in that arena. State Medical Director Dr. Mary Applegate will follow with a run through of the LTSS Toolkit. The toolkit covers a wide variety of infection prevention and control topics, from communication logistics to PPE. After lunch, Dr. Weigand will discuss COVID testing. The day will conclude with a presentation by Dr. Turner on an overview of COVID from an epidemiological perspective.

ODM to start MDS exception reviews early Nov

ODM notified The Academy that they expect to resume MDS exception reviews on November 02, 2020. A more detailed update will be provided as we near this anticipated start date. ODM noted that the exception reviews will be performed from remote locations. (Back to top.)

#### Notes from the ODH provider meeting

The Ohio Department of Health held its weekly provider meeting last week. Below are notes from the meeting:

\* *PCR confirmatory test*: Dr. Marika Mohr from ODH's Bureau of Infectious Disease walked through the CDC's "<u>CONSIDERATIONS FOR INTERPRETING ANTIGEN</u> <u>TEST RESULTS IN NURSING HOMES</u>" flow chart. She confirmed that one negative PCR test was acceptable to consider a staff to return to work if the PCR test was done within 48 hours of the antigen test in a low incidence county. Please see the flow chart for more information.

\* *Use of KN95 masks:* Providers have to maintain documentation as to why they are using KN95 masks in place of N95 masks, including attempts to obtain N95 masks. Providers may choose to use KN95 masks in place of surgical masks when surgical masks are appropriate.

\* Use of eye protection: ODH said they are following the CDC's healthcare worker guidelines for the use of eye protection. *The guidelines state that healthcare workers should wear eye protection*. <u>Please see the CDC guidelines for</u> <u>healthcare workers for more information by clicking here</u>.

\**Fire Marshal's "citing" temporary walls*: Fire Marshals will be creating a "citation" for providers that use the temporary walls for cohorting under the PHE waiver. It is not really a citation, nor is it recorded as one. It is a note about the wall to create a "paper trail" so the Fire Marshal's office can go back to the facility and be sure the wall is removed after the waiver period has expired.

# EDIC replay: ODH lab portal webinar TODAY at 1 PM; 10/05 testing schedule

EDIC highlights from last week's Academy Update:

*ODH Lab Portal Bulk Upload* - You should see a batch upload tab in the electronic lab submission portal. This function will allow you to upload data stored in an excel sheet to generate the PDFs. This would mean you only need to capture the required data from those you routinely test once and alter only the fields that need to be altered prior to each upload. Instructions for use of the batch upload are attached. Any file that is uploaded must match the template file (also attached) and be formatted according to the instructions on the second sheet of that template document. #### CMS releases QSO memo on emergency preparedness

CMS recently released <u>QSO-20-41-ALL</u>: Guidance related to the Emergency Preparedness Testing Exercise Requirements- Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The document allows providers to use the real emergency experiences from COVID-19 to count for EP requirements. From the summary: "Emergency Preparedness Testing Exemption and Guidance - CMS regulations for Emergency Preparedness require specific testing exercises be conducted to validate the facility's emergency program. During or after an actual emergency, the regulations allow for an exemption to the testing requirements based on real world actions taken by providers and suppliers. • This worksheet presents guidance for surveyors, as well as providers and suppliers, with relevant scenarios on meeting the testing requirements in light of many of the response activities associated with the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE)." <u>Please click here to view the memo. #### NHSN to accept POC test data October 15

CDC's National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN) will release a new Point of Care (POC) Laboratory Reporting Pathway within the NHSN LTC COVID-19 Module on October 15, 2020. The new Pathway will enable CMS-certified nursing homes, and other long-term care facilities, to meet the Department of Health and Human Services' requirement to report SARS-CoV-2 point-of-care antigen test data, and other on-site COVID-19 laboratory testing data, to appropriate federal and state health authorities. *Using the pathway will require an upgraded NHSN Secure Access Management Service (SAMS) from Level 1 to Level 3. Please be on the lookout for an email invitation from CDC to perform this upgrade.* 

This new NHSN Pathway will provide a single reporting system that nursing homes already use for other mandatory COVID reporting and will meet the requirement to report SARS-CoV-2 point-of-care antigen testing data to state health departments and other appropriate federal authorities.

the subject line "Enhancing Data Security" to begin upgrading their SAMS access to use this Pathway. (Back to top.)

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#### Updated SNF QRP Tip Sheet available

An updated version of the SNF COVID-19 PR Tip Sheet that was posted on September 8, 2020, is now available. The purpose of this Tip Sheet is to help providers understand CMS' public reporting strategy for the PAC QRP in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency (PHE). This Tip Sheet explains the CMS strategy to account for CMS quality data which were exempted from public reporting due to COVID-19, and the impact on CMS' Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Quality Reporting Program (QRP) data on the Nursing Home Compare website refreshes.
