H.B. 87: Sex offender notification

Status: House Judiciary Committee

Bill summary related to long-term care:

- Would require the sheriff with whom an offender or delinquent child who is a specified type of tier III sex offender/child-victim offender or public registry-qualified juvenile offender registrant has most recently registered under the SORN Law and the sheriff to whom the offender or delinquent child most recently sent a notice of intent to reside under that Law to provide written notice that includes specified information about the offender or delinquent child to the manager of a long-term care facility where the offender or delinquent child will reside or that is located within the specified geographical notification area and within the county served by the sheriff.
- Would require the manager of a long-term care facility who receives a notice described in the preceding dot point to provide a copy of the notice to all residents of the facility and to the sponsor of each of those residents.
- Would direct the Department of Health to compile, maintain, and update twice a year a list that contains the name of each long-term care facility, the county in which it is located, and its address and telephone number.
- Would require the Department of Health to provide the list described in the prior dot point, upon request, to the sheriff who is required to provide community notification.

- Would require licensed practitioners (examples include therapists, dietitians, nurses, physician assistants) to wear photo identification badges when providing direct care to a patient/resident.
